**Area of Concern 1: Refinement of Administrative Structure and Supportive System**

(A) Overview

On the whole, the School had progressively optimized the administrative structure and supportive system and the implementation was smooth. The relevant strategies and work of the various objectives had been progressed smoothly and the expected results had been achieved. Moreover, the school administration had been further transparent, institutionalized and standardized so that the administrative efficiency had improved and the foundation of the School's long-term development had become more concrete. During reflection and review, in addition to the relevant measures to be continued this year, the School needs to further strengthen the functions of the committees through the administrative reorganization and strengthening the assistance on the operation of the Alumni Association after its return.

(C) Summary

In the school development cycle, the School had been working hard to institutionalize and standardize the development of the School under the consensus of various administrative staff. We are also committed to supporting the professional development of our colleagues and strengthening our cooperation with our partner groups. We have achieved the desired results in many areas. In the coming year, we will continue this year's direction, reorganizing of Religious Committee and Arts Development Committee. Two Chairmen of the committees will supervise the relevant subjects and curriculum, so that the culture of the collaboration between the groups will be stronger. In addition, we will assign Vice-Chairmen for Career Guidance Committee, Academic Affairs Committee and Extra-curricular Activities Committee for further support and for saving talents for the school's administration. Moreover, the assistance on the operation of Alumni Association will be strengthened next year in response to its return.

## Area of Concern 2: Strengthening Teaching Planning and Support to Raise Teaching Effectiveness

### 1. General Review

In 2016-2017, the school performed satisfactorily in strengthening teaching planning and support. Based on the analyzed data, we had implemented different strategies to improve students' performance. The result was satisfactory. In recent years, all departments have put great effort in reviewing the "active learning" strategy. We believe that active learning could help to extend learning beyond the classroom and effectively enhance students' learning efficiency. In order to foster a culture of "active learning" in school and nurture new talents, we encourage students to organize different activities by themselves with teachers' assistance. We believe that students' participation will improve the quality of the activity. Moreover, all departments have adopted e-learning in their curriculums and numerous sharing sessions have been held. In the future, our school will continue to refine the implementation of "active learning" in order to enhance the learning effectiveness. The Dream University Workshop and Mentorship Programme will be further improved.

### 3. Summary

Our school strived to improve the teaching and learning strategies over the years and the overall performance was satisfactory. In 2016/2017 academic year, all departments adopted the "active learning" strategy in their curriculums. In the future, we will further refine the teaching strategy and strengthen the implementation of active learning and e-learning. Some committees will be involved in promoting "active learning", for example, Association of Student Leaders, Association of Music Leaders, New Clubs and Global Classroom Collaboration Unit etc. The Dream University Workshop and Mentoring programme would be further optimized to provide a better support to S6 students. It is expected that the school-based E-Platform would be developed to enrich students' knowledge on JUPUS.

### Area of Concern 3: Enhancement of Christianity-based Value Education

#### 1. General Review

On the whole, the work of strengthening of the spirit of Christ-based school value education has been carried out. The performance was satisfactory and most of the expected results were achieved. The Value Education and Moral & Ethics courses were successfully implemented to S.2 and S.5 respectively and the effects were significant. This could let students understand Lutherans' characteristics more. In order to promote a good class atmosphere, class teacher support group meeting was held regularly. Teachers could get know of the situations and needs of all forms more so as to optimize the classroom management strategies. In addition, Counseling Committee was committed to optimizing the system of rewards and punishments. Through 'Self-Perfection Scheme', the staff of the School would have a more consistent requirement for the quality of the students. The policy of 'Self-Refinement Scheme' was refined as 'Self-Perfection Scheme' and standard of classes having good performances was reviewed (Gold, Silver and Bronze Award) in order to enhance students' good behavior and promote excellent class atmosphere.

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**Overview of Target 1: Promote value education in formal courses**

In the formal and non-formal courses, colleagues of the different sub-groups worked together and strategically promoted the values education focused on the “Lutheranians” characters and the focus area were board. The effects of Value Education of S1 and S2 were significant. Yet, the effects of S3 or above were slightly inferior to the expectation. The Moral & Civic courses in the second term strengthened the part of students’ reflection and sharing, and educational psychologists were invited to participate in designing the curriculum. The “facing pressure and mood management” element was added. In addition, through the promotion of diversified activities and organizing some experiencing and learning activities related to the relevant values, students should be nurtured with the six characteristics more effectively.

Through the regular meeting of the Class Teacher Support Group, views of the class teachers on enhancing the management measures of classes were collected so that we could gain a better understanding of the situation and needs of all forms. In this year, we had further optimized the system of rewards and punishments and held a "Sharing Session on the refinement of Self-Perfection Scheme". The staff of the School had a more consistent requirement for the quality of the students. We had optimized and re-examined the performance criteria of the class to enhance their good behavior and promote good atmosphere. Overall, the attention level of teachers and students on the class atmosphere, as well as the class atmosphere, was better than before. In the next academic year, the school will optimize the discipline system and other support through 'Self-Perfection Scheme' so that the class atmosphere can be more perfect.

### Overview of Target 3: Strengthening religious atmosphere

Various measures to strengthen the religious atmosphere were implemented smoothly, and a routine practice had been established. The director of Tin Yiu Life Lutheran Church is the member of the Committee, and hymn singing was held regularly at the entrance to convey the message of 'loving people, loving god'. Also, WATOTO concert was successfully held so as to deepen the elements of 'loving yourself, loving people' and to create a richer religious atmosphere. In the next school year, the religious atmosphere will be further enriched by holding S1 worship and blessing ceremony, strengthening the parental gospel education work and re-examining the junior forms' curriculum and assessment method.

(C) Summary

Over the past year, the results of most projects were as expected. In the coming year, we will continue to highlight the six major virtues of Lutheranians, which were chosen by all stakeholders in the School, in the formal and non-formal curriculum. The Value Education is centered on religion and further enriches the religious atmosphere. order to build a better class and school atmosphere, the discipline management system and 'Self-Perfection Scheme' will be refined in the next year so as to remind students of important behavior requirements and discipline, expecting students to be more outstanding in characters and behavior performance. In order to enhance students' sense of belonging to school and to understand the concept of school policy, we will continue to fulfill the spirit of "active learning" through the participation of students in the planning of co-curricular activities, such as exchange programs of Global Classroom and sports camps. Finally, we are committed to strengthening the school atmosphere, highlighting good values, such as the addition of scholarships to honor the Lutherans with outstanding performance in conduct, service, religious ministry and other non-academic areas.
